



### Get to Know Sky Hunters Education Raptors Burrowing Owl

The burrowing owl nests in a hole in the ground. Here in southern California, they regularly use holes of California ground squirrels. Burrowing owls live in dry, open areas with no trees and short grass. They are also found in developed areas like golf courses, vacant lots, fields or pastures. The burrowing owl is diurnal—foraging during the day and night—but they are most active in the early morning and evening. Prey includes insects, scorpions, small mammals, birds, amphibians, and reptiles, and owls catch more insects during the day and more mammals at night. Researchers can easily tell what owls have been eating from the regurgitated pellets of indigestible food like fur, bones, and beetle carapaces. Owls catch their prey like other raptors with their feet; they hunt by walking, hopping, or running along the ground, or by flying from a perch.
